

## Warm Braid Cable Wristuarmers

Wristwarmers such as these are really useful in the winter, especially now that heating oil has become so expensive! These are designed to allow your fingers and thumbs room to move, so you can knit and type without having the wristwarmers get in the way.

These are an excellent first cabling pattern; if you've never tried to cable, try this! It's easier than it looks and the results are gratifying.

## Materials

- 1 skein Cascade Pastaza, (bulky, 50\% Llama/50\% Peruvian Highland Wool, $100 \mathrm{~g} / 132 \mathrm{yds}$, color 065) (this may be enough to do two pairs!)
- 4 double-pointed or circular needles, US \#9
- A cable needle


## Gauge

4 sts per inch in K2P2 rib pattern, lightly stretched.

## Pattern Notes

You can knit the cable panel with either the chart or the written out instructions. Both are included on the last pages of this pattern.

## Directions

## Section 1: RIBBED CUFF (BOTTOM)

Cast on 32 sts and distribute over three needles as follows:

- 12 sts on first needle
- 12 sts on second needle (this will be the cable panel needle)
- 8sts on last needle

Join and place marker.
Knit K2P2 rib (*K2, P2 and repeat from *) on each round until you have a 1 inch length cuff. Go to section 2: Cable.

## Section 2: CABLE

On the next round, knit as follows:
1st needle: K2P2 rib, ending with P2
2nd needle: Cable pattern as in chart
$3 r d$ needle: K2P2 rib, ending with P2.
Repeat this until the you have completed the last round (round 8) of the third cable pattern repeat (a total of 24 cable rounds). Go to section 3: Buttonhole.

## Section 3: BUTTONHOLE <br> On the first round of the fourth cable pattern repeat: <br> \section*{If this is the right wristwarmer:}

Round 1: 1st needle: K2P2 rib, ending with p2
2nd needle: Cable pattern as in chart (Round 1) $3 r d$ needle: k 2 , bind off 6 stitches.
Round 2: 1st needle: K2P2 rib, ending with p2 2nd needle: Cable pattern as in chart (Round 2) $3 r d$ needle: k 2 , cast on 6 stitches (cable cast-on, or whatever works for you)
Round 3: Continue in pattern as in section 2. Continue knitting in pattern 6 more rounds until you have completed the fourth cable pattern repeat (a total of 32 cable rounds). Go to section 4: Ribbed Cuff (Top).

## If this is the left wristwarmer:

Round 1: 1st needle: k2, bind off 6, k2, p2.
2nd needle: Cable pattern as in chart (Round 1)
$3 r d$ needle: K2P2 rib, ending with p 2
Round 2: 1st needle: k2, cast on 6 stitches (cable cast-on, or whatever works for you), k 2 , p2
2nd needle: Cable pattern as in chart (Round 2)
$3 r d$ needle: K2P2 rib, ending with p 2
Round 3: Continue in pattern as in section 2. Continue knitting in pattern 6 more rounds until you have completed the fourth cable pattern repeat. Go to section 4: Ribbed Cuff (Top).

## Section 4: RIBBED CUFF (TOP)

At this point, change to K2P2 ribbing all the way around. Knit ribbing until you have a 1 inch cuff. Go to section 5, Finishing.

## Section 5: FINISHING

Bind off loosely in ribbing pattern and weave in ends. Voila!


## Pable Snstructions

## Abbreviations:

cn: cable needle
Cr3L: sl 2 sts onto cn and hold to front, p 1 from left needle, k 2 from cn
Cr3R: sl 1 st onto en and hold to back, k 2 from left needle, p 1 from cn
C4B: sl 2 sts onto cn and hold to back, k 2 from left needle, k 2 from cn
C4F: sl 2 sts onto cn and hold to front, k 2 from left needle, k 2 from cn
Cable chart (read from right to left):


## Key:


$\square$ purl


Cable (alternate) instructions:
Round 1: Cr3L, Cr3R, Cr3L, P3
Round 2: P1, K4, P2, K2, P3 (On these
even rounds, you are just knitting the knit
stitches and purling the purls)
Round 3: P1, C4B, P2, K2, P3
Round 4: P1, K4, P2, K2, P3
Round 5: Cr3R, Cr3L, Cr3R, P3
Round 6: K2, P2, K4, P4
Round 7: K2, P2, C4F, P4
Round 8: K2, P2, K4, P4
